Please provide any personal background information you would like to share with the employees of the district.

I retired from my position as the Director of Choirs for Boswell High School after 30 years in the district. I began my career at Weatherford High School and was fortunate enough after my first year of teaching to be selected as Choir Director for Boswell in 1990. Weldon Hafley was the principal who hired me, Bill Anderson was the superintendent and we were a district with one high school, one middle school and a handful of elementary schools. Being a part of the tremendous growth in this area has been of one of the most exciting parts of my career.
